The Secret is Out: AARP Lists Anderson as Best Place to Live and Retire

Anderson, SC has been acknowledged as one of the best places to Live and Retire for 2021. In a November round-up, Anderson joined cities like Cedar Falls, Iowa; Jackson, Tennessee; and Fort Worth, Texas as ideal locales in which to retire. Some changes have sprung up for people after the pandemic, especially the desire for space. "We learned that space matters. According to a University of Vermont survey, 59 percent said the pandemic taught them that nature is integral to their well-being." Seemingly at odds with this desire is the reliance and need for technology and the internet. A lower cost of living rounded out the requirements along with a strong sense of community. Anderson, a town relatively unknown outside of South Carolina, ticks all of those boxes. Airbnb also lists Anderson as one of the Top 10 trending destinations worldwide for the fall

in 2019.

Described as having "budget Southern charm," the lower cost of living is an attraction to those retiring and living on fixed incomes with median housing costs around \$900 per month. Access to an excellent healthcare system is another boon to the area, with the AnMed Health System fulfilling all needs with regards to hospitals, clinics, and private practices. Also helping to keep residents healthy and happy

is the abundant access to nature. "65% of Anderson residents live near parks and recreational facilities" according to AARP. Nestled in the foothills of the Appalachians, there are gorgeous mountain hikes nearby to go along with the many lakes in the area, including Lake Hartwell. For those who love the outdoors, there is no shortage of things

thriving arts community. The Arts Center hosts a gallery and classes in pottery, painting, and ceramics." 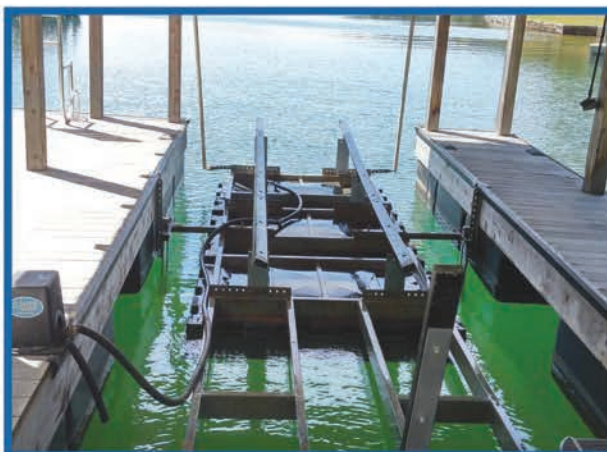

In addition to the top states and lakes listings, Lake Homes Realty also produces a quarterly report with trends nationally and by state. The report shares a summary of this information collected from 131 MLS areas from the 34 states we serve and is, to our knowledge, not available from any other source. Collectively, the lake real estate market within the 34 states covered by Lake Homes Realty is \$31.8 billion for the Winter Quarter.

The team up of Anderson and Greenville is the perfect combination with the lake providing a most excellent spot for the tournament itself, and the larger city of Greenville providing hotels, restaurants, and centers needed for the rest of the event. “The Upstate of South Carolina is thrilled to welcome the Bassmaster

Classic back to Lake Hartwell for the fourth time since initially hosting back in 2008,” said David Montgomery, Vice President of Sales for VisitGreenvilleSC. “Not only has the Classic set attendance records each year it has returned, but it has proven to be one of our largest economic impact events for the Greenville region.”

Several competitors slipped out onto the lake before the off-limits period to get a feel for the lake and have great things to say. Patrick Walters of Summerville, SC commented “There are a lot of fish in the lake; I don’t think numbers will be a problem. The lake level is also promising and looks to remain so for the tournament with fish being found in both deep water and shallow. Matt Arey of Shelby, NC commented on the unseasonably warm winter the Carolinas have experienced this year. “Unless we get a hard push of cold weather and then a warming trend,

I think it could keep the fish scattered throughout the winter, and it could make it a little more diverse”

All events are free to the public, with the Bassmaster Classic Kickoff Party on Thursday, March 3. Takeoffs from the Green Pond Landing will also host booths and activities from sponsors. The doors to the weigh-ins at Bon Secours Wellness Arena open at 3:15 p.m. for the general public. The expo will run at the Greenville Convention Center on Friday, March 4 from Noon-7pm, Saturday from 10 a.m.-6 p.m., and from Sunday from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. However

Anderson County Sees Record Level of Employment Heading into The New Year – Unemployment Rate Drops To 2.7%

89,383 Anderson County residents were employed as of November, according to new data released by the SC Department of Employment & Workforce.

“One year ago, almost 4,500 of our friends and neighbors were unemployed due to the results of the pandemic” said County Council Chairman Tommy Dunn. “I am thankful to announce today that number has declined by almost 50 percent. This stands as testimony to the resiliency of our local economy and, most especially, our people.”

The county’s 2.7% unemployment rate represents a decrease from the 2.9% recorded in October and is the lowest rate observed since the onset of economic disruptions related to the pandemic. By way of comparison, the county’s unemployment rate peaked at 11.8% in May 2020.

The unemployment rate for the state of South Carolina in November was reported at 3.7 percent.

The resiliency in the local economy can be attributed in large part to the county’s ongoing commitment to economic development efforts. Despite the lingering effects of the pandemic, in 2021 Anderson County announced new and expanded economic development projects representing more than \$350 million in capital investment and creation of 1,100 new jobs.

Anderson County also worked to spur activity in the travel and tourism sector, most significantly through hosting events at Green Pond Landing. During 2021, tournaments staged at Green Pond attracted more than 1,450 boats and 6,000 spectators, resulting in a local economic impact in excess of five million dollars.

The decade from 2010 to 2020 began and ended with significant nationwide economic distress; however, three data points of interest recently released by the US Federal Reserve serve to highlight gains in the economic health of our community:

- Adjusted for inflation, the Gross Domestic Product for Private, Goods-Producing industries in Anderson County increased by 35 percent, rising from \$1.49 billion in 2010 to \$2.01 billion in 2020.
- Median household income increased by 36 percent, from \$38,851 in 2010 to \$52,667 in 2020.
- Over the course of the decade, the number of children living in poverty in our community dropped by one-third, and the total number of persons living in poverty declined by almost twenty percent.

Anderson County Council and staff extends their best wishes to each and every one of you for a happy holiday season and a prosperous and healthy new year. ■

New Hartwell Lake Master Plan Makes Minor Updates to Previous Plan

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Savannah District, released the new Hartwell Lake Master Plan. The updated plan follows the previous master plan closely.

The Master Plan serves as a comprehensive land and recreational management plan, according to Sandy Campbell, the Natural Resource Program Manager at the Hartwell Dam and Lake Project. It guides the stewardship of natural and cultural resources and the provision of outdoor recreation facilities and opportunities to ensure sustainability of federal land associated with Hartwell Lake.

“The revised Hartwell Lake Master Plan is the accumulation of a tremendous amount of hard work by the Army Corps team, our partners, stakeholders and members of the public,” Campbell said. “The Corps of Engineers incorporated input from the public, including community members and area stakeholders, to ensure future management actions are both

environmentally sustainable and responsive to public outdoor recreation needs.”

The completed Master Plan is available at <https://go.usa.gov/xecXv>.

The updated master plan contains an accompanying Environmental Assessment that assessed potential impacts of the revised Hartwell Lake Master Plan on the environment, resulting in a finding of no significant impact. The plan does not address water management in the reservoir, nor does it change shoreline management rules. The Corps updated the shoreline management plan in 2020.

A master plan does not appropriate funding for any improvements or developments, but effectively portrays where potential projects could be authorized if funding or a strategic partnership becomes available. Master Plans do not change the technical operations of a lake as related to their congressionally authorized project purposes.

“This revision is part of a larger, USACE-wide effort to bring master plans up to date across the country,” Campbell said. ■

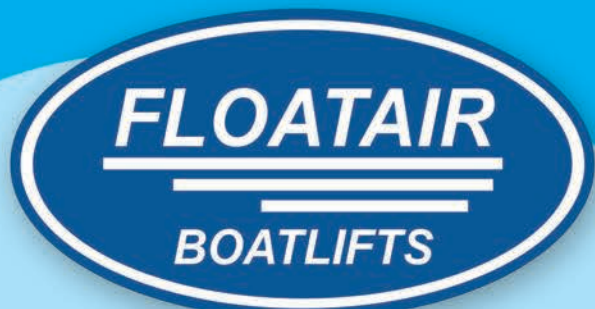

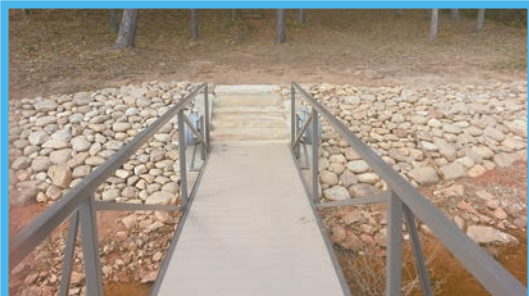

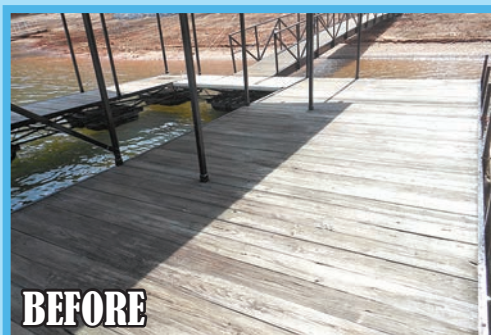

Avian Influenza Confirmed in South Carolina

A wild duck harvested by a hunter in Colleton County, S.C., is the first wild bird since 2016 to be found infected in the United States with the Eurasian H5 type of highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI), officials have announced.

The bird, an American wigeon, was tested by the Clemson University Veterinary Diagnostic Center in Columbia and the diagnosis was confirmed by The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (USDA-APHIS).

This type of HPAI virus is considered a low risk to people but it can be danger to the poultry industry, which is an important part of South Carolina's agricultural economy.

"We're asking that anyone involved with poultry or egg production, from large farms all the way down to backyard flocks, review their biosecurity practices to assure the health of their birds," said State Veterinarian Michael J. Neault, who directs Clemson Livestock Poultry Health, which includes the Veterinary Diagnostic Center.

"So far we have no indication that HPAI has jumped from wild migratory birds to poultry and we'd very much like to keep it that way," Neault said.

USDA has alerted the World Organization of Animal Health, known as OIE, of the discovery as required under international trade protocols.

So far in 2022, Europe has been kept busy with H5 cases of their own, reporting to the

OIE scattered infections across the continent from Portugal to Bulgaria. In December, Canada reported two separate cases in the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.

Julie Helm, a veterinarian and poultry specialist with Clemson Livestock Poultry Health, advises South Carolinians to protect small poultry flocks with two simple statements: "Keep it AWAY and Keep it CLEAN."

Keep it AWAY: Keep your poultry and pets away from wild ducks and geese and their environment — ponds, lakes and swampy areas. Take care not to track the wild waterfowl virus back to your flock if you are hunting or hiking in the wild waterfowl environment. Buy new birds from a reputable source. Keep new birds or returning show birds separated from your established home flocks for 30 days. Keep pests (rodents, raccoons, opossums, rabbits) out of bird pens. Keep visitors out of your bird areas; what may they be carrying on their feet, clothing, or vehicles?

Keep it CLEAN: Clean cages and coops. Clean any equipment first before it comes onto your property. Wear designated farm shoes and clothing to care for your birds. Wash your hands before and after working with your birds. Change birds' food and water daily. Wash your vehicles and trailers after visiting other poultry facilities and before you come home — Go through a car wash. The U.S. Centers for Disease Control (CDC) considers the risk of HPAI H5 infections to the public

to be low. No human infections from Eurasian H5 viruses have occurred in the United States. Nonetheless, USDA Veterinary and Wildlife Services recommends hunters and others to take precautions to protect themselves and the domestic birds they may encounter from the virus: *Do not harvest or handle wild birds that are obviously sick or found dead. *Dress your game birds in the field whenever possible. If you must dress birds at home, clean them in an area in which your poultry and pet birds have no access. *Keep a separate pair of shoes to wear only in your game cleaning area. If this is not possible, wear rubber footwear and clean/disinfect your shoes before entering or leaving the area. *Do not eat, drink, or smoke while cleaning game. *Always wear rubber gloves while cleaning game or cleaning bird feeders. *Wash hands with soap and water immediately after handling game or cleaning bird feeders. If soap and water are not available, use alcohol wipes. *Use dedicated tools for cleaning game, whether in the field or at home. Do not use those tools around your poultry or pet birds. *Wash all tools and work surfaces with soap and water and then disinfect them. *Avoid

cross-contamination. Keep uncooked game in a separate container, away from cooked or ready-to-eat foods. *Cook game meat thoroughly; poultry should reach an internal temperature of 165 °F to kill disease organisms and parasites. *Double bag the offal and feathers. Tie the inner bag; be sure to take off your rubber gloves and leave them in the outer bag before tying it closed. *Place the bag in a trash can that poultry and pet birds cannot access. This trash can should also be secure against access by children, pets, or other animals.

They say necessity is the mother of invention and that is certainly true of the Aqua-Stairs line of boat ladders and dock ladders. At Adairco, LLC, all we sell are dock ladders for marine and boating use.

Back in the late 1990s, I was attempting to make it easier to get people and pets up onto my dock that did not have the physical ability to climb up on the traditional straight up and down dock ladders. I studied the traditional dock ladders and swimming pool ladders, none of which accomplished what I needed. I needed a ladder that most everyone, including dogs, could use to get out of the water. I also was concerned about those that did not swim well and wanted something for them to get out with easily, sort of a safety ladder. It needed to be a wide step ladder as well as a deep step ladder – this would allow for comfortable footing. No more skinny steps that hurt your feet!

Understanding that some people did not have the physical ability to climb up and down a dock ladder, I knew that a stair step

ladder would fix most issues. Starting with wood, I made staircase dock ladders that worked somewhat, but these dock ladders were difficult to keep from floating up, making them difficult to use. When I did get the wooden swim ladder to stay down, it became waterlogged and was too heavy to rotate out. And worst of all, those dock ladders quickly became too slippery to use due to the growth of algae and slime.

The only solution that made sense was to make a boat or dock ladder out of lightweight aluminum. Stainless steel would make them much heavier and considerably more expensive to fabricate. This made it easy to rotate them out of the water to keep clean and more durable. We first started making these flip-out swim ladders in just a 4-step dock ladder model and quickly found that people with fixed docks needed a 6-step dock ladder since water levels varied on some lakes and of course, coastal areas. Since then, we had made several other models for docks (3/4/5/6/7 step models) to accommodate the special needs of the elderly, young, and those with certain handicaps.

Next, people started requesting angled pontoon boat ladders, so the development of a sloped ladder for side entry and rear entry was made. The rear mount pontoon boat ladder was then adapted next for the swim platform on larger boats and yachts. Some people have used these folding

Boating Safety in South Carolina

We are never prepared for the unthinkable to happen but happen it did for Randall and Karen Smith in 1997 when a drunk boater crashed into their boat. Their 11-year-old son Drew was killed in the accident, prompting them to fight to make waterways safer for everyone. They've had success in getting law makers to pass Drew's Law in 1999 that strengthened boating laws, but there is more work to be done.

Randall started the Boating Safety in South Carolina Facebook group in March of 2021, and they now have over 2000 members as well as prompting the creation of 25 groups statewide dedicated to the crucial subject. He is also the Chairman of the SCCVC Boating Safety Committee and is dedicated to boating safety education and the passing of more boating laws. The group also serves as a voice for the victims and families killed or injured in boating accidents. There are videos of several close calls on our waterways by irresponsible boaters. These are just a few of the captured examples of why the boating safety laws must be tightened in South Carolina. The statistics on boating fatalities increased by 25% in 2020 when compared to 2019; 767 lives were lost in recreational boating accidents just last year.

This year, Randall championed South Carolina Bill S.497, proposing to tighten boating laws and increase education. The Bill would require the Department of Natural Resources to issue a boating safety certificate upon the completion of certain requirements and make it unlawful for people to operate

certain watercraft in South Carolina without the certificate. It also would include a revision of the term "personal watercraft" and make changes to what watercraft people younger than sixteen years of age could operate. Although the sensible Bill passed through the Senate, it did not make it to the House floor; it was stalled waiting on a hearing and was killed for the year. Randall is also working to pass a second Bill, S.29 (Boating Liability Insurance) which would require owners of watercraft of more than fifty horsepower to carry liability insurance of at least \$50,000 of coverage per occurrence and provide penalties and provide for the collection of fines. This would include jet skis as well as boats with the first offense being punishable by a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$250, increasing with multiple offenses to include up to a \$1000 and/or one year in prison. The fines would go to a fund with the purpose of working of creating a boater training and safety program for the State.

Randall will be bringing the Bills back up in January of 2022 and is urging South Carolinians to reach out to their Representatives to ask for the Bill to be scheduled for a hearing. According to Randall, Chris Murphy with the House of Representatives in Columbia would be the best contact to urge a hearing to discuss this boating bills. Winter Kayaking Checklist: Prep for Cold Weather Paddling

For those who love the serenity of the outdoors, winter kayaking often comes with the benefits of fewer people on the water and beautiful snow covered views. However, paddling during the winter requires a high level of respect for the elements and special safety considerations.

If you've been wondering, can you kayak in the winter? The answer is yes, but make sure you know what you need to safely paddle during the winter months. Winter kayaking gear and winter kayaking clothing needs are much different than other seasons of the year, particularly when there is a chance for immersion.

While you should always consult with an outfitter or kayak safety pro, these key winter kayaking tips will give you a general idea of how to prepare for cold weather adventures on the water.

GET A KAYAKING DRY SUIT: Not sure what to wear winter kayaking? When the water temperature drops below 60 degrees Fahrenheit, you'll want to wear a kayaking dry suit. You can wear winter clothing layers underneath the protective dry suit layer made from a special membrane fabric or neoprene. Dry suits are 100% water resistant and built specifically for cold weather kayaking.

DRESS IN LAYERS: Wear a dry suit as your outermost layer, then layer your clothing underneath the dry suit in the same manner that you would for any other outdoor activity during the winter. The closest layer to your body should be made of some sort of synthetic, non-cotton material. Synthetic materials do a much better job of wicking moisture away from your body and drying quickly when they get wet.

WEAR A PFD MADE FOR PADDLING: US Coast Guard Type III PFDs (personal flotation

devices) are essential pieces of kayak fishing gear to have during any season of the year. Life jackets or PFDs are the safest way to keep yourself afloat if you happen to capsize and will make it easier to climb back into your kayak. For winter kayaking, it is recommended that you wear a PFD that is rated for five to ten pounds more than the weight of your body.

USE A SIT-INSIDE KAYAK: While sit-on-top kayaks are more popular for fishing because they are generally more stable as well as easier to get in and out of, sit-inside models are best for winter kayak fishing or paddling activities because they serve the purpose of protecting your lower body from the water and cold winds. In other words, sit-inside kayaks will provide a drier paddling experience and will also give you more space to keep your winter kayaking gear secure.

PROTECT YOUR HEAD AND EARS: If you have a dry suit that is made with a hood, you will already have a waterproof head covering built into your outermost paddling layer. Although, make sure you wear a beanie or insulated cap underneath to protect your ears and provide extra insulation while on winter kayaking trips.

WEAR PADDLING GLOVES: Neoprene paddling gloves that are waterproof or water resistant are a requirement to keep your hands dry and protected from the cold weather. Unlike regular gloves, kayak gloves will also have non-slip fabric on the palm side which allows you to keep a tight grip on your paddle and your kayak fishing accessories.

Can you kayak in the winter? Absolutely, if you apply these tips and are properly prepared for the elements. Get outside and try winter kayak bass fishing or just take in the winter scenery on a self-guided paddling tour. ■

2022 Bassmaster Kayak Series Registration Now Open

Registration is now open for the 2022 Bassmaster Kayak Series powered by TourneyX season, which will visit iconic fisheries in six states. For the first time, the 2022 Kayak Series will feature the Old Town Bassmaster Kayak Series Angler of the Year award with \$5,000 cash and a top-of-the-line Old Town kayak going to the angler who accumulates the most points during the regular season.

The 2022 Kayak Series schedule features five regular-season events and the Bassmaster Kayak Series Championship that will coincide with the 2022 Academy Sports + Outdoors Bassmaster Classic presented by Huk.

“In just two years we’ve been amazed by the growth of the series,” said B.A.S.S. Nation Director Jon Stewart, who oversees the Kayak Series. “We knew kayak fishing was experiencing major growth — that’s why we started this back in 2020. But I’m not sure we had any idea just how popular it was.

“It’s been really fun to watch anglers enjoy this trail as the sport continues to evolve.”

The schedule begins on one of the big bass capitals of the country as the Kayak Series visits Lake Fork in Alba, Texas, Feb. 5-6 for one of three two-day events this season. In the past, all events except the championship have been one-day tournaments. Nebraska’s Nate Gloria took home the Lake

Fork title in 2021 with a five-bass limit measuring 98 inches while Arkansas pro Cody Milton earned a Century Belt with five bass measuring 100.5 inches in 2020’s inaugural tournament on this big bass factory.

From there, the next stop will be Richard B. Russell Lake in Anderson, S.C., for the two-day Bassmaster Kayak Series Championship, March 2-3. The tournament field will be comprised of qualifiers from the 2021 Kayak Series — and though the tournament will actually conclude on March 3, the winner will be revealed March 4 and receive a first-place prize of at least \$20,000 on stage at Bon Secours Wellness Arena before

the first-round weigh-in of the Bassmaster Classic.

The inaugural 2021 Championship tournament on Possum Kingdom Lake near Fort Worth, Texas, featured a record-breaking



performance by hometown angler Mark Pendergraf who won with a two-day, 10 bass total of 209.25 inches — the highest two-day total in TourneyX history.

“That record-setting limit is the equivalent to weighing in a 30-plus-pound bag,” explained Stewart. “What a way to introduce the Classic crowd to the hammers on the Kayak Series!”

Among the Championship qualifiers in Anderson will be Bassmaster Elite Series veteran Mike Iaconelli from New Jersey, who won a Kayak Series event last year on the Upper Chesapeake Bay, as well as Tennessee angler Jim Davis, who became the first two-time Kayak Series winner with a victory last year on the Upper Mississippi River in La Crosse, Wis.

“The series is not even three years old and it’s already developing its own rich history,” Stewart said. “Ike winning an event was a big deal in the fishing industry. He touted it himself as one of the accomplishments he’s most proud of — and that’s from a guy who has won a Classic, won Angler of the Year, won Elite Series events.

“Several big sticks are also emerging. Some guys are so serious about kayak fishing that they show up at every event with a genuine chance at winning.”

After the Championship in South Carolina, the Kayak Series will visit the Harris Chain of Lakes in Leesburg, Fla., on March 19, Grand

Lake O’ the Cherokees in Grove, Okla., on April 16 and Lewis Smith Lake in Jasper, Ala., on May 21. All of those venues have been regular destinations for major B.A.S.S. events, and one — Grand Lake — was the site of the Bassmaster Classic in 2013 and 2016.

The Kayak Series will conclude with the third two-day event of the season on Pickwick Lake in Counce, Tenn., on Oct. 8-9. That event will decide the final Old Town AOY race and the final qualifiers for the 2023 Bassmaster Kayak Series Championship. The Top 25 anglers in the AOY points race along with qualifiers from

Bassmaster regional and state championships will earn a spot in the Kayak Series Championship. Anglers will earn points in every regular-season tournament with their lowest finish dropped to determine the final Angler of the Year standings.

As in the past, anglers will use the TourneyX app and photograph their bass on special measuring boards to submit their catches. The angler with the most inches of bass will be the winner. All 2021 winners had at least 85 inches of bass. ■
